
Below is a summary for the Rocklin Police Department crime rate and performance for 1/1/19 - 11/23/19.


Crime Rate and Trends

• Crime rate is currently 13.4, a decrease of 2% from the same time period last year.

 - Motor vehicle theft decreased 4%





Crime Summary


Reported crime in the City of Rocklin continues to remain relatively steady with the exception of theft from vehicles which experienced an increase of 19% over the same reporting period for 2018. Robbery saw the largest decline, 33% (decrease of 5 crimes) and Aggravated assault saw the largest increase, 39% (increase of 9 crimes). Theft from unlocked vehicles continues to be an issue across the region and the State. The City of Rocklin and the Police Department recently launched a social media campaign reminding our followers to "Take it, Lock it or Lose it." We will continue with this campaign periodically over the next several months. Overall Crime is up 2% but when adjusted for population growth, over the same reporting period last year, it actually shows a decrease of 2%.

Total police incidents have increased by 6% (an increase of 222). The vast majority is from a 13% increase in Officer Initiated incidents (up 742 incidents). Overall arrests remain consistent and traffic citations are up 5%. Traffic accidents are down 5% overall although non-injury collisions are up slightly, 2% (increase of 5). Rocklin continues to be one of the safest cities in the region and the State because the men and women of this organization work hard at keeping our community a safe place to live, work and play.
