


Below is a summary for the Rocklin Police Department crime rate and performance measures for 1/1/20 - 6/30/20 compared to the same time period in 2019.

### **Crime Rate and Trends**

- Crime rate is currently 8.2, an increase of 11% from the same time period last year.
- Total part 1 crime increased 13%
- Total violent crime increased 29%

- Motor vehicle theft decreased 12%





# **Crime Summary**

Overall crime in the City of Rocklin Increased to 8.2 crimes per thousand, up from 7.4 crimes per thousand in 2019 (+11%). Total part 1 crimes increased by 13%. This increase is represented by eight (8) additional sexual assault crimes (Rape) over the same period in 2019. Of the eight (8) cases, five (5) were incidents that occurred previous to 2020 and were reported in this timeframe. Robbery saw an additional five (5) crimes over 2019. Five (5) of the robbery cases resulted in an arrest with one of the arrests clearing a series of robberies that were occurring in several cities and at least two counties. Total theft crimes, across our City, increased 12% (+59) over the same period 2019. The vast majority of these are larceny crimes representing shoplifting (+11%) and theft from vehicles (+38%). Most vehicle larceny crimes are for theft from an unlocked vehicle. 73% of all crimes occurring in the City are represented through locked and unlocked vehicle burglaries (45%), and larceny (28%).

Residential and commercial burglary shows a decrease of 6% (-5) while auto theft shows a decrease of 12% (-5) from the previous 2019 time period. In addition, aggravated assault displays a 20% decrease over 2019 with four (4) less occurrences. Total traffic collisions across the City decreased by 17% (-32). This reduction represents a 16% (-6) decrease in injury related collisions and an 18% (-26) decrease in non-injury collisions.


