RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKLIN AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR CITY SERVICES (ROCKLIN MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 3.32) AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 2021-192

WHEREAS, through enactment of Rocklin Municipal Code Chapter 3.32, the City maintains a service fee cost comparison system for the purpose of recovering some or all of the costs reasonably borne of providing services of a voluntary and limited nature through fees for those services, so that general taxes are not diverted from general services of a broad nature and utilized instead to subsidize such services of limited benefit; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Rocklin Municipal Code Chapter 3.32, the City Manager has reviewed the amount of each service, and has reported the results of the review, along with supporting documentation, to the City Council, in the form of the 2022 Fee Study, and has recommended that the amount of certain fees be amended to reflect changes in costs reasonably borne; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2022, a noticed public hearing was held and oral and written testimony was received and considered on the recommended amount of the service fees and supporting documentation in full compliance with Government Code 66016 through 66018; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the City Council to adopt a schedule of fees based on the City's budgeted and projected costs reasonably borne for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Rocklin as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council of the City of Rocklin adopts the fee schedules attached hereto which schedules establish the costs reasonably borne of each service specified, and the percentage of the cost the City Council determines to recover through service fees.

Section 2. The City Council of the City of Rocklin adopts Exhibit 1, setting forth the fully burdened hourly costs of selected City personnel as specified. In cases where the fee structure does not accurately reflect a specific fee for the service, the City Council authorizes the department head to use an hourly rate or average hourly department rate as a basis to establish the amount of the fee.
