WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that more than 287,850 new cases of invasive breast cancer in women will be diagnosed in the United States in 2022; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society, White women and Black women have the highest documented breast cancer incidence rates in the United States, and Black women have the highest documented breast cancer mortality rates in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society advises that early diagnosis and treatment increases the survival rate for those with breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rocklin joins communities across our nation to increase awareness about the importance for women to make an informed decision with their health care provider about early detection and testing for breast cancer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Rocklin does hereby proclaim the month of October 2022 as Breast Cancer Awareness Month and urge all Rocklin residents to acquaint themselves with the issues involved in breast cancer awareness.
